<u>Mr. Brian McMahon</u>



Mr. McMahon has litigated major antitrust cases including:

- As part of a joint litigation team, recovered \$3.5 billion for California natural gas and electricity customers and over \$30 million for the City of Long Beach and its natural gas ratepayers in antitrust case
- Recovered more than \$300 million in litigation against major oil companies for conspiracy to underprice crude oil
- Assisted a Federal Interagency Task Force concerning underpayment of federal crude oil royalties
- Assisted the State of California in antitrust concerns over the merger of two major oil companies

Mr. McMahon has testified numerous times before the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives in various crude oil royalty issues. He successfully urged the U.S. Department of Interior to change its valuation regulations for federal crude oil on behalf of the State of California. He has also given presentations regarding crude oil, natural gas and antitrust issues.

His publications include "Tying Law: The Clash Between the Supreme Court and Lower Courts" in *Competition*, The Journal for the Antitrust and Unfair Competition Section of the State Bar of California and the chapter, "Antitrust and Unfair Competition in Regulated Industries" in, *California and Antitrust & Unfair Competition Law*, IV. Ed.

For many years, Mr. McMahon has been a member of the Executive Committee of Antitrust & Unfair Competition of the Los Angeles County Bar and presently is the First Vice President of the Executive Committee.

Tim Chang is a partner at Wasserman, Comden & Casselman, L.L.P. Tim has published numerous law journal articles related to foreign investment, nonprofit laws and Taiwan's legal status in U.S. Courts. In 2009, he co-authored a book entitled "U.S., China, Taiwan Transnational Taxation Q&A", published by Harvard Inspired Publishing in Taipei in Traditional Chinese language and by Shanghai Fudan University in Simplified Chinese language.
